ABOUT THE WORKSHOP


Bargello, also known as Florentine, is a needlework technique with a long history and examples have been found in Hungary, Italy and even Great Britain. It's a type of embroidery known for its even stitches worked in gorgeous geometric shapes with colour changes that often mimic waves or flames.

In this class you will use this very effective but simple stitch technique to create a beautiful and useful trinket box that you can use to store anything from sewing supplies to jewellery.

Total costs: 2-day workshop fee: \$200 + kit cost: \$30 = \$230

The kitset will include:

- Canvas
- Card
- The pattern

You will need to bring:

• Perle 5, in five different colours

The amounts I used, just to give an idea:

Navy- 8m, blue- 6m, pale blue- 5m, cream- 7m, yellow- 6m.

- 24 tapestry needle
- Lining to go with thread colours- 27x25cm
- Strong sewing cotton for lacing
- Your usual sewing kit including hoops, sharp scissors, needles, pins, magnifying glass, personal lighting etc
