REGISTRATION OPENS for ANZEG members on **November 12, 2025 at 7am** and **November 23, 2025** for all others.

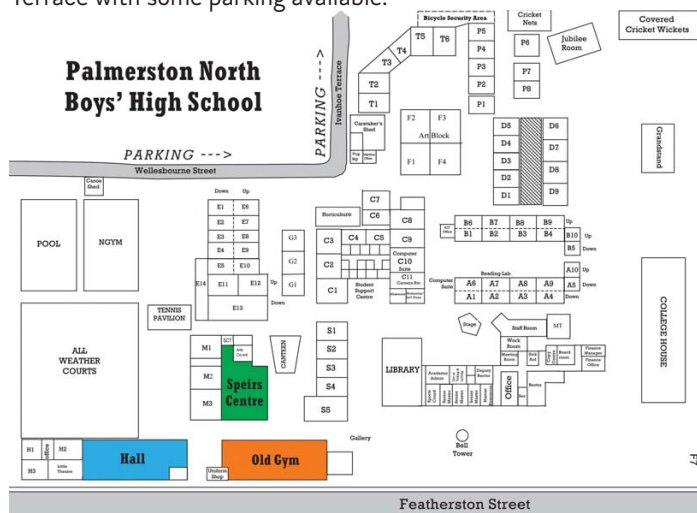
Registration is available via the website – click on the link to register. This will only be live from November 12.

Payments may be made by bank deposit or credit card (an additional 2.9% processing fee applies to credit card payments). Payment must be received within five working days to confirm your workshop place.

Any registration forms received by post will be entered online by a volunteer, in random order beginning on November 12. All payments will be issued with a receipt.

Conference Location

All events (excluding the National Embroidery Exhibitions and Conference Dinner) are being held at Palmerston North Boys High School (PNBHS), 263 Featherston Street, Palmerston North Central, Palmerston North 4442. Main entry is via Featherston Street. There is also entry via Wellesbourne Street and Ivanhoe Terrace with some parking available.



The cafeteria will be in the Old Gym (orange on the map) and the Merchants Mall and Guild Displays will be in the Hall (blue). We will be using the Speirs Centre (green) for the Conference and the PNBHS classrooms for the workshops.

Car Parking

There is some public parking around the school, along Featherston and Wellesbourne Streets and Ivanhoe Terrace with access to the school from those streets. However, it is on a first-in first-served basis. There is also some parking on the school grounds which will be reserved for those with special access needs.

Registration Conditions

Everyone must pay the Base Registration Fee of \$100 per adult ANZEG member, \$125 per non-member, or \$20 per young person (under 19). Conference events, including The Embroidery School, have their individual fees, in addition to the Base Registration Fee.

Registrations made after March 31, 2026 will incur a late registration fee of \$25.

Registration Desk

The registration desk will be located at the front of the Hall (blue on map). Hours are: Saturday July 4, 11am-5pm and Sunday July 5 to Thursday July 9, 8.30am-4.30pm.

Cancellation Policy

Registrations cancelled before March 1, 2026 will be refunded, less an administration fee of \$30.

Refunds after March 1 and before June 1, 2026 will be made only if your place can be refilled in a workshop, and less an administration fee of \$60.

Note that you may send a friend in your place, at no penalty, but please advise the change in name so that we can welcome her/him with the correct nametag.

The Conference committee may consider any application for refund on its own merits.

No refunds will be made after June 1, 2026.

If there are insufficient enrolments by March 2026 a workshop may be cancelled. Please enrol early to ensure your favourite goes ahead. If a workshop is cancelled for any reason, you will be advised as soon as possible and offered either an alternative or a full refund of fees.

Force Majeure: In the case of circumstances that are beyond the control of ANZEG and the Conference hosts, eg, local or national disruption in case of fire, natural disaster whereby the venue(s) and/or travel are affected severely, and the Conference is cancelled, an administration fee of \$15 will be deducted from the registrant's refund.



Dis/Less Abled Access | Medical

Palmerston North can be very wet in winter so please ensure you bring rainwear and umbrellas. Please wear suitable footwear for walking the short distances between halls and classrooms. The school has wheelchair access but there is no lift and some classrooms will be on the second floor. There will be some parking available for those with walking difficulties. Please advise if you have special access needs.

Palmerston North Hospital A&E department, 50 Ruahine Street, Roslyn, Palmerston North, is 2.1 kilometres from the school and is easy to find.

Meals

Morning tea and lunch are to be served in the Old Gym (orange on the map). Payment is included if registering for the Association Weekend and/or a workshop(s).

For those who would like to, and if you are planning to hear an after-school speaker, there will also be an afternoon cuppa available in the Old Gym between the end of classes and the speaker's presentation.

If you have a medical reason for a special diet, please advise on the online registration form.

Water bottles are allowed in the classrooms, but no hot drinks or food.

Accommodation

There are many motels and hotels in Palmerston North and lots of Airbnb options.

Massey University: \$100 per day

We have also arranged a special offer for conference attendees to stay at Massey University Halls of Residence. 92 rooms in Walter Dyer Hall have been reserved for attendees. These are all individual rooms with bedding provided. Bring own towels. Shared bathroom facilities and a kitchen are provided on each floor. There is also ample space for sitting and stitching in the evenings in the Monro Common Room. The rooms are spread over four floors – there is no lift. We will make every attempt to accommodate people with mobility issues on the ground floor – please make us aware on the online registration form.

Your own transport is recommended. Massey is 6.5 kilometres from the school so people using this accommodation will have to make their own way to and from the school, or use public transport which entails two bus trips to get from Massey to PNBHS.

Transport

Palmerston North airport is 5.4 kilometres (approximately 10 minutes travel) from the city centre. Taxi shuttle services are available. Taxi, bus and Uber services are also available. Uber also has a designated rideshare pickup and drop-off area at Palmerston North Airport.

If you wish to travel from Wellington Airport to Palmerston North by road there are multiple daily bus services which depart Wellington from Wellington Airport and the Wellington Railway Station, Platform 10, and take approximately 2 hours 15 minutes to reach Palmerston North.

If travelling by car Palmerston North is easily accessed via State Highway 3.

Merchants' Mall & Guild Displays

This will be open from 12 noon on Saturday July 4.

A selection of embroidery and related businesses will have stands in the Hall (blue on the map) on the Featherston Street side of the school.

This will also host the Registration Desk, Guild Displays and ANZEG Mystery Stitchery Display. There will be raffles available for purchase as you enter.

Continuous free entry for Conference Registrants and students who present Student ID, with a gold coin koha for non-registrants and the general public.

Guild Banners

Please bring your Guild's banner (and display) to the registration desk between 11am and 3pm on Saturday July 4. A committee member will direct you to where each will be mounted.

These can be removed on Wednesday July 8, 2-5pm.

Display of Guild Work

Guilds are invited to exhibit a self-contained display of work no larger than 1m x 1m, which can be attached to a velcro-receptive black panel. (Should the display fall off the board no guarantee can be made to reattach.)

These will be exhibited in the Hall alongside the Merchants' Mall and will be open to the public.

You will be able to hang your own display on Saturday July 4 from 11am. Name of Guild signage will be on the board.

This is an opportunity for Guilds to showcase their members' work over the past two years. It is not intended as a competition and therefore will not be judged.



Extensions Day

SATURDAY July 4, 9.30am-3pm at Square Edge.

Extensions Day will be held at Square Edge (where the National Exhibition is housed). The programme will be full and varied with more information provided nearer the date. It will include the Extensions BGM.

The fee for the day is \$60pp including morning tea and lunch. Only paid Extensions members may attend – biennial (two-year) subscription is \$20. The subscription form is on the website (pay via internet banking): www.embroiderynz.co.nz/extensions

An informal opening of the exhibition will be held at Square Edge at 10am on Saturday July 4. (The exhibition will be open to visit until 4pm). This should give conference-goers ample opportunity to see the exhibition. Because it is such a small venue, the exhibition opening will be followed by morning tea back at the school from 11am before the opening of the Merchants' Mall and Guild Display exhibition at 12 noon.

Registrations & Payments

Workshop registrations open online for ANZEG members on Wednesday November 12, 2025 at 7am and November 23 for all others.

Registrations close May 31, 2026.

The online system will display which workshops still have vacancies. Your place is reserved as soon as you book it. It is confirmed once paid.

Payment may be made immediately by credit card or, if you are paying by internet banking or bank deposit, you will be issued with an invoice which must be paid within five days or the reserved place is forfeited.

If booking by paper form, a volunteer will enter this online for you starting on November 12. Paper registrations will be entered in random order – your booking will not be processed any faster.

All communications – confirmations, invoices, receipts, needs lists – will be sent by email. If you do not have an email address, please ask a friend or family member if you can use theirs.

If you do not supply an email you must send three, stamped, self-addressed envelopes with your registration. Be aware that posted material will take longer to arrive.

Fees

All students are required to pay the Base Registration Fee, even if they are not attending other events at Conference.

Workshop fees are all stated clearly on the chosen class. Travel costs have necessitated us increasing the fees for overseas tutors. Fees include your morning tea and lunch. Payment by credit card or by bank deposit is preferred.

Kits & Needs Lists

Some tutors will provide a kit for their workshop. The cost is specified in the description and fees are included in the online registration system.

Simple needs lists are available on the website. Full lists/homework will be provided as soon as your class has been confirmed and your payment has cleared.

Skill Levels

The skill level is indicated against each workshop. If you are inexperienced and take an advanced class, not only will you struggle, but you will hold up the rest of the class.

- **Beginners:** No previous experience in this technique;
- ◆ **Intermediate:** You have some experience in this technique, or you're an experienced stitcher who can pick it up;
- **Experienced:** You have previous experience in this (or a similar) technique;

- **All levels:** Workshop is suitable for all levels of experience and will be taught to the student's ability.

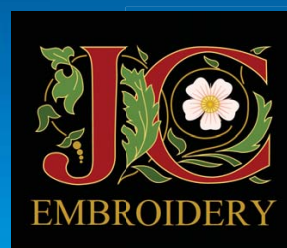
