**Dowse Art Museum – Softy: Textiles from the Dowse Collection 18 October 2025 – 15 March 2026**

*SOFTY brings together artists from The Dowse's textile collection who use the language of fabric and fibre to unpick ideas of masculinity, labour and identity. Once used to belittle sensitivity, here the term 'softy' has been reclaimed to celebrate the generosity and tenderness of these textile practices. Softness isn't just a material choice, but a strategy used to interrogate assumptions that textiles are for 'softies.'*

*An exhibition celebrating the richness of tivaivai, created by the Porirua-based collective Tipurepure Au Va'ine.*

*Tipurepure Au Va'ine is a tivaivai collective that has gathered every Thursday in Porirua since 2019. Rooted in a proud lineage of Cook Islands va'inetini (women's groups) and au va'ine (women's guilds), Tipurepure Au Va'ine come together to sustain, celebrate, and evolve the practice of tivaivai. Their weekly gatherings also emphasise the important social role of tivaivai. In addition to being a treasured Cook Islands artform, tivaivai is also a social practice. Through making, Tipurepure Au Va'ine nurtures language, kinship and culture, creating a space for Cook Islands identity to thrive in Aotearoa.*

*This exhibition honours both the artistry and social importance of tivaivai and Tipurepure Au Va'ine. Conceived as a living, breathing space, the gallery will host a rotating display of tivaivai made by Tipurepure over four months. **For one day each week, members of Tipurepure will work on-site, transforming the gallery into a communal making space and offering audiences an open invitation to observe, learn, and connect.** Alongside new works, tivaivai selected from public collections will also be shown — reconnecting makers with historical patterns, techniques, and the stories stitched into every piece.*

Enjoy the opportunities to look, learn and stitch.
